News from our classes

What has been the most memorable learning this week?

EYFS:

Lovely to have everyone back after a very hot half term. All the children had lots of stories to tell about trips to the park, swimming, picnics and lots of ice creams.

Nursery have been reading a story called Handa's Surprise, looking at new fruit, learning new names and tasting a guava, passion fruit and an avocado.

Learning where these fruits come from and how different fruits grow.

Reception have been reading and learning about under the sea animals.

Their story is called The Storm Whale, it's about a little boy who finds a baby whale washed up on the beach after a storm, the little boy takes the whale home to care for him and finds out the whale is a great listener.

A great start to our final term. Still loads of fun and learning ahead. Well done EYFS!!

Year 1:

The children returned after half term looking refreshed, confident, and so grown up! They threw themselves enthusiastically into learning... In Writing, we began exploring our new text, 'The Last Wolf' by becoming detectives, hunting for clues and discovering lots of new vocabulary to help them predict what the story might be about.

In Maths, we have been learning all about money and practising making different amounts using 1p, 2p, 5p and 10p coins. The children have loved 'shopping' in our pop-up store and taking part in a classroom auction!

In Humanities, we launched our new topic on the fabulous world of Carnival, listening and dancing to the lively sounds of steel drums to immerse ourselves in the celebrations and traditions of carnival culture.

			We continued learning about plants in Science and were delighted to discover how much our plants had grown over the half-term break. The beans and lettuce are looking very healthy and the recent rain has also brought plenty of snails who seem to be enjoying our plants just as much as we are! In RE, we listened to a few parables and discussed the important lessons that Jesus taught through his stories. Well done on a great first week back, Year 1. 🙌🙌
Year 2: Year 2 have had a great first week back at St Matthias after half term! We have started looking at the relationships between the 5 and 10 times table, and have been using these to solve word based problems. We have also started looking at Rosie Revere, Engineer in our writing lessons, and we even made our own inventions through junk modelling! In RE, we have started to explore Christian values and how these apply to our daily lives. In Humanities, we have started to learn about Jamaica and we are considering the similarities and differences to the UK. In Science we are continuing to explore plants further, and alongside this our sunflowers are doing very well! Well done to Year 2 for all of your hard work this week!	Year 3: Year 3 have had a brilliant start to the term! We are exploring two new books. In Writing, we are reading <i>Into the Forest</i> by Anthony Browne. We have begun to explore the text and have written a personification poem based on the forest setting. In Reading, we are exploring <i>Charlie and the Chocolate Factory</i> by Roald Dahl. The children are thoroughly enjoying this text! In Science, we are focusing on rocks, understanding that they are natural materials used to create many everyday objects. We are also addressing common misconceptions about materials that people often think are rocks. Well done, Year 3!	Year 4: Year 4 have had a fantastic first week back. They have come back focused for the last half term ahead! In Reading we were very excited to start our new text Harry Potter, we have even renamed our tables to match the houses at Hogwarts! In writing we are using Manfish to explore the underwater world. We will be writing an Invention Narrative to explain how Jacques Cousteau made the AquaLung. In RE we began looking at natural resources found across the world and looked at the difference between renewable and non-renewable resources!	
Year 5 Faith: Faith have had a great week back from half term. In Maths we have continued fractions, building on their prior learning from y4! reading we finished our text coming to England, thinking about how Floella may have felt as a young girl coming from Trinidad to England! In writing we started looking at our new text King Kong, making predictions based on some clues and the illustrations given, they made amazing predictions about the text! In PSHE year 5 started their new topic changing me, thinking about their body and self image. On Wednesday y5 were able to take part in an amazing science workshop that allowed them to be curious and ask questions. Well done y5 you have worked hard this week!	introduced our new text King Kong. We have written predictions and also simile poems based on the character of Kong. In maths we have continued learning about fractions with a focus on converting improper fractions to mixed numbers and vice versa. We have completed our topic on forces in science, with our final lesson taking place on Thursday, in which we learned about various mechanisms and how they help make our lives easier. We completed our final lesson on the Middle East, where we learnt about the current situation in the Middle East and also thought of ways to improve the lives of those living there. Well done Class Hope!	showed great enthusiasm, confidence and commitment. Well done to everyone who auditioned! In English, we started writing a suspense narrative, focusing on building tension and engaging the reader through descriptive language and carefully chosen vocabulary. The children have enjoyed developing their ideas and writing to entertain. In History, we continued our learning about the Industrial Revolution. This has linked particularly well with our production of <i>Oliver!</i> as the story is set during this period. The children have been making connections between the historical context and the themes explored in the play. We also took part in our second Mentivation workshop session, where we discussed how to use social media responsibly. The children reflected thoughtfully on the importance of making safe and positive choices online and considered how their actions can impact both themselves and others.
