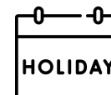

"THE BIG TWO": ARRIVING ON TIME & COLLECTING ON TIME.

8:30-8:45 Start

To ensure we get off to a flying start, it is vital that all children are in their classrooms and ready to learn by 8:45AM. This is when our registers are officially taken.

Being in your seat by 8:45AM means your child is marked present, hears the morning's first instructions, and starts the day feeling calm and prepared. If a child arrives after the register closes, disruption to the class and a rushed start to their day.

3.30pm

Just as a calm start is vital, a predictable finish is just as important for a child's emotional well-being.

If a child is not collected on time, they stay in their classroom until 3.40pm, they then go to the office.

While our office staff are always happy to help in a one-off emergency, please remember that the front office is a very busy hub of school administration.

When children are left there waiting for collection, it means our team must step away from their vital work to provide supervision. To keep the school running smoothly, we ask that all children are collected promptly from their designated areas.

News from our classes: What has been the most memorable learning this week?

EYFS:

This week has been full of exciting learning and celebrations across our setting!

We have been learning about Eid and exploring why it is such a special time for many families. The children really enjoyed taking part in our very own Eid celebration. They had the opportunity to make delicious pakoras and some special sweets, which they were very proud of. It was a lovely way to experience different cultures through food and celebration.

In RE, we have been focusing on the Easter story. The children learned about how Jesus went to a special place to pray, helping them begin to understand the meaning behind Easter in a simple and thoughtful way.

In Nursery, the children have been enjoying the story of The Ugly Duckling. They have been listening carefully, joining in with the story, and talking about kindness and how everyone is unique and special.

Alongside this, we have been very busy getting creative and making beautiful Easter decorations to brighten up our learning environment. The children have loved using different materials and showing off their creativity.

It has been a wonderful week of learning, celebrating, and creating!

Year 1:

Year 1 have worked incredibly hard this week, and they should be very proud of everything they have achieved, especially all the focus they showed while sitting assessment papers..

In writing, we have uncorked our imagination, coming up with ideas and descriptive language, creating our very own "Wild Thing" characters. Maths has been great fun, with lots of practical learning and group activities focused on commutative addition and number bonds to 10.

The children had a fantastic afternoon in Science, sorting animals into carnivores, herbivores, and omnivores, and in RE, we shared a thoughtful discussion about Holy Week, reflecting on the meaning of real love and sacrifice. Humanities gave us pause for thought as the children learned why our oceans are so important, helping them develop their social conscience and showing a strong determination to protect the oceans and care for the planet.

A wonderful week of learning...well done, Year 1! Let's keep up the fantastic effort as we head into our final week of term.

Year 2:

A huge congratulations to all of Year 2 for all their hard work during this assessment week. They have shown great resilience and determination! We have not paused in our learning this week either - in writing, we started researching facts about orangutans and even narrated our own nature documentary! In maths we revisited 2 digit addition and subtraction. In humanities we looked at the physical geography of Wales and Northern Ireland and in PSHE and Science we explored the benefits of each food group and how healthy eating helps our bodies.

Year 3:

Year 3 have spent the week showcasing their phenomenal learning by completing reading, writing, and maths assessments. All the children demonstrated resilience and determination, and they have made us incredibly proud.

We ended the week with a well-deserved trip to the library, where we enjoyed listening to a fantastic story and had the opportunity to choose books to take home.
