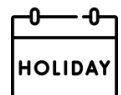

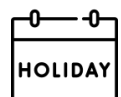

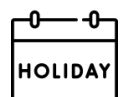

News from our classes: What has been the most memorable learning this week?

EYFS: Another busy week in EarlyYears, we have all joined KS1 for Playtime this week in the big playground to help Year 6 to focus for SATs. What fun we had running,climbing,chasing friends, playing basketball and den building with Ms Clem In class we have been learning more about Minibeasts.Nursery have been singing the Nursery rhyme Incy Wincy Spider and talking about why he was climbing the water spout. We have also read the story by Eric Carl “The Very Busy Spider.” Reception have been learning more about “What makes places special” and have been on a virtual visit to a mosque and used their treasure hunt sheets to find important items.	Year 1: What a fantastic week we have had in Year One! In Maths, we learnt about non-standard and standard units of measurement, using dominoes, paperclips and cubes, before graduating to rulers and learning how to measure in cm. They had great fun measuring all sorts of objects around the classroom ...even my boots! In Writing, we have started composing diary entries as Erin, desperately trying to save her beloved Black Rock. The children have been using wonderful descriptive language and showing great empathy for the character. In Humanities, we learnt more about why Mary Seacole went to Crimea and thought about what she might pack in her suitcase, whilst in Music, the children created their own superhero theme tunes, which were imaginative and fun! We also had a wonderful and culturally enriching trip to Aziziye Mosque. The Imam explained so much about what happens in the mosque and the importance of prayer. For many of us, it was our first visit to a mosque, and the children showed such respect, behaving beautifully throughout the visit making us very proud. What a great week Year 1, let's keep it going for our last week of this half term!	
Year 2: Year 2 have had a brilliant week with lots of learning. They have worked very hard across all of their subjects, and had a very exciting trip to Aziziye Mosque with Year 1. Here we met the Imam, who showed us how all of the things we have learnt about in RE work in practice. This was very insightful, and the children asked very interesting questions. Huzaifa even showed us how to pray in a beautiful demonstration! In class we have started learning how to tell them time, including hours and half hours. We have also dissected seeds to understand our plant growth in science. We have started writing character descriptions in writing based	Year 3: Year 3 have had a wonderful week. They have been extremely supportive during the Year 6 SATs, swapping classrooms to give Year 6 a calm and quiet environment. In writing this week, we planned and began writing our secret diary entries, taking on the role of an Egyptologist who has discovered a lost artefact. In maths, we have been exploring fractions of an amount. Year 3 have successfully applied their multiplication and division knowledge to solve these problems confidently. In humanities, we explored the Ancient Egyptians’ beliefs	Year 4: Year 4 have had a great week! We have finished our fantastic diary entries in the character of a refugee. We used thought provoking vocabulary to explain the emotions of the character. In maths we have been using our knowledge of mixed numbers and improper fractions to complete addition and subtraction problems. In RE we looked at the Sikh ceremony of langar, where vegetarian food is offered to everyone in the community to reinforce their message of equality and kindness. In Science we investigated how pitch is created and looked at how tension can affect this. We have worked really hard this week - Well Done Year 4

on the book 'The King Who Banned the Dark'. We have also learnt about Bessie Coleman in Humanities, which has been very inspiring! It has been a lovely week, and we are looking forward to seeing more hard work next week!	about the afterlife and how they believed people entered the Field of Reeds (heaven). Well done year 3		
Year 5 Faith: Year 5 Faith have been working hard this week. In maths we revisited our topic on Division, using our times tables and multiplication knowledge to do short division and answer word problems. Year 5 showed great resilience and kept on going even when they found it difficult! Within our reading lessons, we continued reading our new book, understanding a bit more about the Windrush generation, sparking the curiosity of children within our classroom. In writing we continued to immerse ourselves in our final outcome which is a survival guide, learning more about how adventurers can keep safe in the wilderness and creating amazing imperative sentences! Preparing for our big write next week. In science we continued to learn more about forces, looking at air and water resistance, preparing for our investigation next week! Well done year 5, you have been amazing this week!	Year 5 Hope Year 5 Hope have been working extremely hard in ensuring they understand how to work out long multiplication and short division. The hard work is evident and I am very proud of them! We are going to be writing our final outcome for this unit based on the Lost Book of Adventures. We will be writing a survival narrative which we started to plan today. In science we learnt about air resistance, water resistance and the fact that they are both forms of friction that work in the opposite direction of movement. We will be investigating air resistance in greater depth next week. In humanities, we learnt about what led to the conflict in the Middle East in 1948 between the Arabs and Israelis which provides context and perspective on current ongoing issues.
