#### News from our classes: What has been the most memorable learning this week?

#### Year 1:

This week we carried out an experiment to find out whether the weather forecast for the week was accurate. We made rain gauges and left them outside our recorded the amount of rainfall daily to see if our predictions were correct!

#### Year 2:

Do all fingerprints look the same? We conducted our own experiment to find out. We found that each individual has their own unique fingerprint!

#### Ms Frohock's PE:

This week, Ms Frohock took the Y6s for PE, where they practised their communication and dribbling skills. Well done Y6 and well done Ms Frohock!

#### Year 3:

Year 3 made some excellent predictions this week when we were learning about seismic waves. We made our own seismometers and tested if different activities impacted the seismic waves.

#### Year 4:

Year 4 had a fantastic week using their key scientific skills to predict and observe their fingerprints. They used cocoa powder to take each other's prints. They then observed to try to answer the question... Are all fingerprints the same?
