News from our classes: What has been the most memorable learning this week?

EYFS:

We have been writing a review of our storybook Anna Hibiscus Splash. We shared which parts we enjoyed the most and the least. In nursery we have been learning about time and using the words before, after and later to describe routines. We have also had lots of fun creating artwork using collage and creating boats out of recycled materials.

Year 1:

This week, Year 1 has been amazing mathematicians! We have been looking at subtraction problems and have used deeper understanding to work out if a reduction or partitioning method has been used.

Year 2:

In humanities, Year 2 has been learning about explorers and adventurers. This week we found out about the life of Sir Ernest Shackleton, a polar explorer. We made biography maps to sequence the key events in Shackleton's life.

Year 3:

This week we have delved deeper into our fraction learning. We have built fraction walls and used our key fraction vocabulary to make interesting generalisations.

Year 4:

This week the children researched and wrote an essay on migration. They also wrote a playscript from their writing stimulus 'The Great Kapok Tree'.

Year 5:

This week, in writing we wrote a personal recount of climbing Mount Everest. In Humanities, we looked at the ongoing conflict between Israel and Palestine.

Year 6:

This week year 6 have begun practising the songs they will be performing in the end of year play. They have all been working so hard and have done a brilliant job!

Mr Selvin's PE:

We have enjoyed a range of team sports this week. Our daily runs were clearly highlighted with how well we did during Hackney Runs over the weekend! Well done STM children.

and needs a blow


in which case
