Keeping Children Safe:

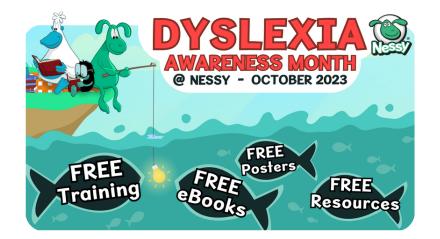
