News from our classes: What has been the most memorable learning this week?

EYFS:

This week we have been exploring the Naughty Bus story - we have had a naughty, cheeky bus visit our classroom to play! We have been using adjectives to describe him and come up with lots of interesting words. In PSHE we have been talking about things we find difficult - and how important it is to keep on trying and never give up.

Year 1:

This week we have been exploring 3D shapes. We have identified real life objects in the classroom or at home that represent 3D shapes. In writing we have been focusing on expanded noun phrases and building vocabulary to describe a terrifying tiger that meets Traction Man.

Year 2:

This year we have been using our voice to write persuasive letters in Writing. We continued our work on multiplication in Maths and in science we looked at what organisms you might find in different habitats. .

Year 3:

This week, year 3 have been exploring different playscripts, they have had a go at acting one out and using another

Year 4:

We have been exploring the life of Anglo-Saxons and what they may have worn, eaten or lived in. It was interesting

Year 5:

This week in Year 5, students engaged in diverse activities, mastering new multiplication concepts and exploring subordinate to identify key features of a playscript. Next week, year 3 will use this knowledge to publish their own script. delving into the Dark Ages and exploring the artefacts they left behind. conjunctions in their writing. They showed great enthusiasm in science and participated actively on our sports inspired physical education day at the Britannia Leisure Centre.

Year 6:

We have drawn on inspiration from our reading book, 'Blackberry Blue', to create our own fairytale characters. We have thought carefully about what horrible traits our villains hold, and what conflicts they will be a part of in our story writing.
