News from our classes: What has been the most memorable learning this week?

EYFS:

Everyone in EYFS had a great time on World Book Day - we loved seeing each others' costumes. This week we explored different materials and created interesting collages with foil, plastic and bubble wrap. Nursery loved immersing themselves in the Three Little Pigs this week and Reception also had some "Big Number" sessions where we explored counting all the way to 50! Well done everyone!

Year 1:

This year we've had a great week! We have been writing our travel journal for the Snail and the Whales adventures! In science we have been continuing looking at seasons! We have explored the difference in weather as we enter spring!

Year 2:

This week, Year two has been discussing women's football and learning about some of our amazing sports people so we can begin to write a speech on inclusivity in sports. We also began working on our new additional and subtraction unit in maths, where we have already shown lots of progress! We also enjoyed designing our own book covers and writing book reviews for this year's World Book Day!

Year 3:

This week, in maths year 3 has been discussing the relationship between the 2 times tables and four times tables. Through these discussions year 3 have been able to improve at completing their four times tables. Well done year 3!

Year 4:

We planned a science experiment last week, and this week we tested out our predictions! In writing, we have been planning a flashback scene from our story 'Journey to Jo'Burg' and generating fantastic words for the different emotions a character could feel.

Year 5:

Year 5's week was filled with curiosity and discovery, from exploring the significance of Ash Wednesday to delving into challenging area word problems in maths. They engaged in hands-on science experiments, uncovering the solubility of different substances, and ended the week by reflecting on making positive choices and understanding the importance of following end-of-day rules.

Year 6:

Year 6 has been comparing and ordering fractions. They have used what they know about making equivalent fractions in order to do this. The class has been working incredibly hard on their arithmetic and have made so much progress - keep it up Year 6!


