

News from our classes: What has been the most memorable learning this week?

#### **EYFS:**

The EYFS have been very busy this week. We have been rehearsing our songs and lines for the upcoming Nativity, and the children are showing great enthusiasm and confidence. In our provision, we have been learning about winter and exploring Arctic animals, as well as discussing what we need to wear now that the weather is getting colder. Nursery have also been enjoying their pre-phonics sessions with Little Wandle, developing early listening and sound skills. In Reception, we have also been learning our digraphs in RWI and practising our CVC writing, which the children have been really excited to show us.

#### Year 1:

Year 1 have been having a brilliant time re-writing the tale of Rapunzul using our best descriptive writing! We have become confident at using our sounds and remembering full stops at the end of every sentence - well done Year 1!

#### Year 2:

Year 2 have been very busy this week, we have been writing our own setting descriptions of the topiary trees from our book The Night Gardener. We have also been looking at different forms of presenting data in maths, such as pictograms and bar charts and using them to help us calculate the difference between amounts. We had great fun in science testing the tyres in our school playground for their strength and flexibility we also learned about how John Boyd Dunlop invented pneumatic tyres.

#### Year 3:

This week, **Year 3** explored volume and capacity, learning their definitions and applying this understanding to read and interpret measurements. In **Humanities**, they examined different settlement patterns including nucleated, dispersed, and linear and connected these arrangements to examples such as cities, towns, and villages. In Science, the class investigated how mirrors work, using labelled diagrams to illustrate how light reflects to create an image.

#### Year 4:

We have had a great week this week! In writing we have completed our Outsider Narratives and have produced some amazing pieces of writing! In maths we have been securing our knowledge of the 3 & 6 x tables and putting them to the test in a tournament. In science we looked at a food webs and saw how it was made up of many different food chains in an eco-system. We wrapped up warm and went on a lovely trip to the Olympic Park Canals where we learnt lots about our water ways.

#### Year 5 Faith:

Faith class have shown amazing learning behaviours this week, within maths they have been working collaboratively and extremely hard to learn about negative numbers within maths. In writing they have started their new outcome, engaging in roleplay preparing to write a letter from the father to the son. In PSHE this week, year 5 looked at how discrimination can affect others and how to stand up to discrimination. Within RE, we engaged in carol singing, looking at the christian beliefs of christmas and whether they are presented in christmas carols.

#### Year 5 Hope:

Hope class have shown great resilience this week! Even though there has been a lot of illness, the children have managed to successfully complete their independent setting narratives (which were lovely to read!) and have now started their new writing unit based on letter writing. The children have revisited negative numbers in different contexts within maths, compared life cycles of a mammal and a bird in science and also compared slums in two different countries (Brazil and India). They have done amazingly well!

#### Year 6:

This week, Year 6 created a scientific model to show how light is reflected, using string to represent light rays and demonstrate how they change direction when hitting a surface. As part of our geography fieldwork, pupils surveyed the local area to find the most common mode of transport, gathering and presenting their own data. In English, the children wrote powerful flashback narratives, focusing on creating atmosphere and tension. We also continued practising for SATs, showing great focus and determination. In PSHE, we explored the ideas of equity and equality, discussing what fairness means in different



Local authorities have a statutory duty to provide, in one place, a description of their offer of support for local families with children and young people who are 0-25 years of age and have SEND (special educational needs and or disabilities). The purpose of the Local Offer duty is to:

- Provide clear, comprehensive, accessible, up-to-date information about available provision and how to access it.
- Make provision more responsive to local needs and aspirations by involving disabled young people, their parents, and local service providers in developing and reviewing what
  is available.

Hackney's SEND Local Offer to families is made up of support from partners across Education, Health, Social Care, and Leisure Services. It includes registered specialist charities, and community and voluntary services where appropriate to the 0-25 cohort with SEND. Our Local Offer website is where we share with families and partners, information from these services about their support, processes, and opportunities.

#### Do you need help, for example, to:

- prepare for a school meeting in order to effectively share your views, wishes and feelings in any discussions
- know what questions to ask when visiting a school for a tour
- make sure that your child's needs are being met at school, college or nursery
- · think about your contribution to an assessment
- go through your EHC needs assessment request
- go through your draft EHC Plan
- Prepare for an Annual Review meeting and make sure your views are included

Attend one of our 20 minutes' drop-in appointments where you can discuss further and receive information, advice, support and guidance from one of our advisers.



Occupational Therapy can help with life skills such as self care skills (e.g. toileting, dressing, sleep and eating), school skills (e.g. attention, focus, writing and cutting) and play skills (e.g. turn taking and sharing).



Drop In is for children and young people aged 0-18yrs

Identify a goal for your child to work towards in their everyday life.



Learn from an Occupational Therapist.
