



News from our classes: What has been the most memorable learning this week?

#### **EYFS:**

We have had a really busy week in EYFS. Our Christmas spirit has been in full swing. We have been writing letters to Sanna asking what we would like for Christmas. We have also been decorating our Christmas tree and making snowflakes practising scissor skills to decorate our classroom, we have also been practising our nativity and our lines. In maths we are looking at different ways to make five and the composition of different numbers and in RE we have been focusing on Angel Gabriel and the message that he had for Mary.

#### Year 1:

It has been another lovely week in Year 1! In Maths, the children have been exploring the part–part–whole model and have shown great confidence in using it to understand how numbers can be broken down. In English, they have been getting creative with instructional writing, planning clear and imaginative steps for how to get rid of the witch! In Geography, we have continued learning about the world around us by exploring the local area of

Hackney. The children have loved sharing their favourite places to visit with their loved ones — with Micky's Chippy proving to be a class favourite!

The festive excitement is also building, as the children revisit the Nativity story and continue practising our Christmas songs.

Year 1 are certainly getting into the Christmas spirit!

#### Year 2:

Year 2 have shown such resilience and determination in their Autumn assessments and Miss Jay and i have been so impressed. We have seen some fantastic progress and results. Well done Year 2! We have also been working extremely hard in our writing planning a dairy entry by analysing a good example. We have also been pattern spotting in maths. In RE we learned about the significance of the Christingle and had a go at making our own and in science we have been using different materials to build our own train carriages.

#### Year 3:

Year 3 have had a week filled with the demonstration of their fantastic learning for the term through the completion of their assessments. Each child has shown resilience and perseverance, which has made the Year 3 team extremely proud!

To end this brilliant week, Year 3 took a trip to Dalston Library to choose their own special books and listen to a story. Head over to Class Dojo to see pictures from this trip!

#### Year 4:

We have had another great week! We have showed amazing resilience in our assessments, showing off all the knowledge that we've learnt in Year 4 so far! In RE we thought about all the selfless things Jesus had done to be named the 'Prince of Peace' We used our knowledge from past years to help us. In science we looked at how food webs are being effective by the damages to the environment. We saw that some animals could potentially go extinct if something was to happen to the food web. We went on a wonderful trip to Regents Hall to hear Apollo Music Orchestra in a festive show. The children showed exemplary behaviour! Well done!

#### Year 5 Faith:

Year 5 Faith have been working really hard this week. They have shown great resilience and determination throughout, as they have been completing their assessments. We visited the Natural history museum on Tuesday! Year 5 learned more about living things and their habitats that they shared in lessons! Within their writing lessons, they have been preparing to write a letter based on their writing text, sharing amazing vocabulary and emotive language throughout. They have shown amazing learning behaviours this week, well done year 5!

#### Year 5 Hope:

It has been another busy week for Hope class, starting with their trip to the Natural History Museum on Tuesday (which was a great success!). The children learned about various groups of animals and the life cycles of insects, which links directly to our science topic in which we have been comparing life cycles across various groups of animals. They also found out that coincidentally, the prominent large blue whale skeleton that hangs over the hall, is also called Hope! This week has been assessment week and Class Hope have persevered through their tests, even when finding questions challenging and have been very mature in their attitude towards their assessments.

#### Year 6:

Year 6 have had a busy and productive Assessment Week, approaching each task with maturity and determination. In science, they carried out an exciting experiment investigating how we can see around corners by using mirrors to explore the behaviour of light. The children enjoyed testing their ideas and discussing what their results showed. In geography, they worked hard to turn the data from their recent fieldwork into clear and accurate bar charts, helping them identify patterns and draw conclusions. We are incredibly proud of Year 6 for their focus. effort and positive attitudes throughout a challenging and rewarding week.



Local authorities have a statutory duty to provide, in one place, a description of their offer of support for local families with children and young people who are 0-25 years of age and have SEND (special educational needs and or disabilities). The purpose of the Local Offer duty is to:

- · Provide clear, comprehensive, accessible, up-to-date information about available provision and how to access it.
- Make provision more responsive to local needs and aspirations by involving disabled young people, their parents, and local service providers in developing and reviewing what is available.

Hackney's SEND Local Offer to families is made up of support from partners across Education, Health, Social Care, and Leisure Services. It includes registered specialist charities, and community and voluntary services where appropriate to the 0-25 cohort with SEND. Our Local Offer website is where we share with families and partners, information from these services about their support, processes, and opportunities.

Hackney SEND Information, Advice and Guidance Service (SENDIAGS) is an arm's length service providing impartial and confidential information, advice and support to parents and carers of children with Special Educational Needs and/or Disabilities (SEND) and young people and children with SEND.

#### Do you need help, for example, to:

- prepare for a school meeting in order to effectively share your views, wishes and feelings in any discussions
- know what questions to ask when visiting a school for a tour
- make sure that your child's needs are being met at school, college or nursery
- · think about your contribution to an assessment
- go through your EHC needs assessment request
- go through your draft EHC Plan
- Prepare for an Annual Review meeting and make sure your views are included

Attend one of our 20 minutes' drop-in appointments where you can discuss further and receive information, advice, support and guidance from one of our advisers.

Occupational Therapy can help with life skills such as self care skills (e.g. toileting, dressing, sleep and eating), school skills (e.g. attention, focus, writing and cutting) and play skills (e.g. turn taking and sharing).



Drop In is for children and young people aged 0-18yrs

Identify a goal for your child to work towards in their everyday life.



Learn from an Occupational Therapist.
