News from our classes: What has been the most memorable learning this week?

#### EYFS:

We've had a very busy week with lots of fun activities in our setting! The children have loved wrapping presents, making gingerbread houses and exploring what our Elf on the shelf is up to. We have been looking at how Christmas is celebrated around the world and the different foods that they eat. We have also been dressed rehearsing for our nativity next week and we are so excited to perform! We have also been exploring the nativity story and orally rehearsing it to draw our story map.

#### Year 1:

It has been an exciting week in Year 1 as we continue to get into the festive spirit, especially with our Christmas lunch. The children had a wonderful time pulling crackers, sharing jokes, and proudly parading around in their festive crowns. In keeping with the Christmas theme, we have also been learning about the different people in the Nativity story and discussing why each one is important, helping the children to develop a deeper understanding of this special time of year.

We have had a fantastic writing week too, as the children have been creating clear and imaginative instructions on how to get rid of the horrible witch from Rapunzel—the very same witch who "trashed" our classroom!

In Maths, we have continued exploring the composition of numbers, taking a deeper look at how numbers are made using the part—part—whole model to support our understanding.

#### Year 2:

What a fantastic week! We enjoyed our trip to see Mamma Goose at the Stratford East Theatre this week - lots of singing, dancing and laughter! We have been working very hard on finishing our diary

In maths we started working on adding 1 digit and two digit numbers together and we explored how humans have created flying machines that were inspired by the animal world.

#### Year 3:

This week, Year 3 began investigating rotation and angles, learning about the degrees of different turns and applying this knowledge to identify right angles. To deepen their understanding, the children explored right angles in the real world. In RE, we had the opportunity to visit our school church and meet with Father David. The children asked him questions about Advent to further strengthen their understanding of the topic. We have also been working extremely hard to learn our Christmas songs for Monday's singalong.

Well done, Year 3!

#### Year 4:

We have had a great week! In writing we have been planning our information report telling the reader all sorts of interesting facts about Polar bears! In maths we have been looking at the 9 xtables and focusing on the relationship between the adjacent multiples and the 3 xtables. In science we looked at the rainforest and the food webs that would live there. We discussed what effects the environment might have on the animals lives and what we could do to help! We have loved practicing all our Christmas songs for Monday!

#### Year 5 Faith:

Faith class have enjoyed preparing for the christmas period, by first enjoying a christmas lunch and for their RE lesson creating christmas cards that portrayed the birth of Jesus! Within their writing lessons, they have completed their writing outcome which is a letter and have begun to publish this to put on a display outside of the classroom. In their Maths lesson, they have started learning about multiplication, looking at informal methods of multiplying, using their knowledge of times tables to help them solve word problems. In PSHE year 5 had amazing discussions about what makes them happy and how that may be similar or different to children in other countries. Well done Faith class you have been working very hard this week!

#### Year 5 Hope:

With assessments finally complete, Hope class have been enjoying learning about short and expanded multiplication in maths, which builds on what they have learnt in previous years. They have also completed their letters in writing, and I have been extremely impressed with their emotive language and the progress they have made with their writing as a whole. The children also enjoyed making Christmas cards depicting the Nativity as part of their RE lesson.

#### Year 6:

This term, Year 6 pupils engaged in a range of meaningful and enriching learning experiences. A group of boys took part in an anti-racism workshop, where they explored respect, equality, and understanding others. In RE, pupils discussed the true meaning of Christmas and reflected on its importance for Christians. In English, writing lessons focused on identifying and applying the key features of a newspaper report, developing clear and informative writing skills. In Geography, pupils carried out fieldwork activities and drew conclusions from their findings, helping them to better understand their local environment and interpret real-world data confidently.



Local authorities have a statutory duty to provide, in one place, a description of their offer of support for local families with children and young people who are 0-25 years of age and have SEND (special educational needs and or disabilities). The purpose of the Local Offer duty is to

- · Provide clear, comprehensive, accessible, up-to-date information about available provision and how to access it.
- · Make provision more responsive to local needs and aspirations by involving disabled young people, their parents, and local service providers in developing and reviewing what is available

Hackney's SEND Local Offer to families is made up of support from partners across Education, Health, Social Care, and Leisure Services. It includes registered specialist charities, and community and voluntary services where appropriate to the 0-25 cohort with SEND. Our Local Offer website is where we share with families and partners, information from these services about their support processes, and opportunities

## Talk to an OT

Do you have any concerns or questions about your child's development?



Occupational Therapy can help with life skills such as self care skills (e.g. toileting, dressing, sleep and eating), school skills (e.g. attention, focus, writing and cutting) and play skills (e.g. turn taking and sharing).



Drop In is for children and young people aged 0-18yrs

Identify a goal for your child to work towards in their everyday life.



Learn from an Occupational Therapist.
