## Welcome back to all our children and a Happy New Year to all!

The staff started the term with a day of learning- in the morning we joined together with teachers and support staff across six schools within our federation. During this time we reflected on the research into effective reading teaching and thought deeply about how to provide the best possible learning opportunities to our children. In effect how to ensure a love of reading as well as strengthening comprehension and fluency. Are your children reading at home? Which books are they really into at the moment?

In the afternoon we spent time thinking about the importance of play times. Recognising that this makes up 20% of the children's day and that it is important we get it right. Encouraging role play, adventure and taking risks. We look at the role of the play worker and what we can do to facilitate play in all areas of the playground. This term we have plans to expand into father David's meadow and get all the children digging and building dens! Exciting times (and possibly muddy times) for all! Please speak to your children about their play times and what they enjoy most. We have been trialling 'mix up monday' where all the children play everywhere and hope to roll this out across the whole week at some point this term. We created a wordbanks of different adjectives and nouns to describe and name the plants and animals that live there, We also spent some time learning more about Queen Victoria who we will be learning more about in our humanities lessons this term - once again Year 2 showed their passion and interest in Historical figures! In maths we completed our work on addition and subtraction - ready to begin learning all about multiplication in the coming weeks.</p>	<p><b>Year 3:</b></p> <p>Year 3 have had a brilliant start to the term, it looks like 2026 is going to be a fantastic year! To kick things off, we have begun exploring the Shang Dynasty, learning about how it began and why it was important.</p> <p>In RE, we have started our Judaism topic, focusing on the key question: What is a covenant?</p> <p>In maths, we have been learning about quadrilaterals, exploring their specific properties and understanding that a square is a type of rectangle.</p> <p>Well done, Year 3!</p>	<p><b>Year 4:</b></p> <p>What a great first week back! This week Year 4 has come back to school with fantastic, positive attitudes! We have begun lots of fantastic learning! In RE we began to look at Hinduism and familiarised ourselves with the different deities and what things they symbolise. In maths we have been looking at the 7xtables. At first we found this a little bit challenging, but we are showing great resilience. In Reading, we have started our new text of Charlottes Web. we have loved learning about the characters and their relationships so far and cant wait to read on. 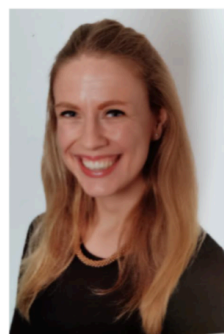
### Keeping Children Safe
