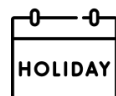

"THE BIG TWO": ARRIVING ON TIME & COLLECTING ON TIME.

8:30-8:45 Start

To ensure we get off to a flying start, it is vital that all children are in their classrooms and ready to learn by 8:45AM This is when our registers are officially taken.

Being in your seat by 8:45AM means your child is marked present, hears the morning's first instructions, and starts the day feeling calm and prepared. If a child arrives after the register closes, disruption to the class and a rushed start to their day.

3.30pm

Just as a calm start is vital, a predictable finish is just as important for a child's emotional well-being.

If a child is not collected on time, they stay in their classroom until 3.40pm, they then go to the office.

While our office staff are always happy to help in a one-off emergency, please remember that the front office is a very busy hub of school administration.

When children are left there waiting for collection, it means our team must step away from their vital work to provide supervision. To keep the school running smoothly, we ask that all children are collected promptly from their designated areas.

News from our classes: What has been the most memorable learning this week?

EYFS:

We've had such a fantastic week—well done everyone! We've been really busy with lots of Easter learning and activities. The children enjoyed learning about the Easter story and talking about what it means, especially thinking about the importance of the stone. There's also been lots of creativity in the classroom, with everyone getting stuck into Easter decorating and making their own hats ready for our Easter bonnet parade—it was lovely to see all their colourful and imaginative ideas!

In maths, we've been learning about odd and even numbers, using practical activities to help us spot the difference and build confidence. In writing, we worked together to make our own class book of *Little Red Riding Hood*, and the children were so proud of their work and loved sharing their ideas.

In Understanding the World, we've been doing observational drawings of plants. The children took their time to really look closely and had a go at labelling different parts—it was great to see their focus and effort.

It's been such a fun, busy week and we're really proud of all the children—well done!

Year 1:

It's been a busy and exciting week in Year 1! We began with a fantastic Easter egg hunt in the meadow, full of excited squeals as the children discovered each "letter clue" and helped one another along the way.

Staying with our Easter theme, we continued exploring Holy Week with the children showing a real depth of understanding about Jesus's sacrifice on Pause day, with their thoughtful and insightful observations. They also created some beautiful collages of the risen Christ, inspired by the cut out work of Henri Matisse.

In Science, we completed our Animals topic by learning about a very familiar animal—humans! We explored our senses through fun activities.

We finished our information texts about our very own "Wild Things," and in Maths, we focused on addition and subtraction with odd and even numbers.

Our Humanities lesson was inspiring as we learned how to protect our oceans by reducing, reusing, and recycling, with children making pledges to help the environment in different ways.

The children have certainly earned their Easter break with all their earnest learning. Well done, Year 1, enjoy your holidays!

Year 2:

This week has been an amazing end to our Spring term with lots of fun and creativity! We have been writing informative texts all about orangutans and have learnt some fascinating facts!

In maths we have been revisiting addition and subtraction of two digit numbers and in Science we explored all about what good hygiene is and why it is important.

We also took some time this week to get creative and reflect on the EasterStory by creating clay sculptures inspired by the Garden of Gethsemane where Jesus prayed before the crucifixion.

It has been a busy term and all of Year 2 have made such amazing progress - enjoy your break!

Year 3:

Year 3 have had an amazing end to the term, focusing on how and why volcanoes erupt – even making our own volcano to see an eruption for ourselves!

We also had a brilliant final Forest School session, where we showed our gratitude to our Forest School teachers and enjoyed making hot dogs together.

Year 3 also had a fantastic Art/Pause Day. We took inspiration from artists Niki de Saint Phalle and Wim Heesakkers, and created our own crucifix sculptures.
