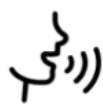

"THE BIG TWO": ARRIVING ON TIME & COLLECTING ON TIME.

8:30-8:45 Start

To ensure we get off to a flying start, it is vital that all children are in their classrooms and ready to learn by 8:45AM. This is when our registers are officially taken.

Being in your seat by 8:45AM means your child is marked present, hears the morning's first instructions, and starts the day feeling calm and prepared. If a child arrives after the register closes, disruption to the class and a rushed start to their day.

3.30pm

Just as a calm start is vital, a predictable finish is just as important for a child's emotional well-being.

If a child is not collected on time, they stay in their classroom until 3.40pm, they then go to the office.

While our office staff are always happy to help in a one-off emergency, please remember that the front office is a very busy hub of school administration.

When children are left there waiting for collection, it means our team must step away from their vital work to provide supervision. To keep the school running smoothly, we ask that all children are collected promptly from their designated areas.

News from our classes: What has been the most memorable learning this week?

EYFS:

It has been a fantastic week back in EYFS!

We have started our exciting new topic all about mini beasts, and the children have loved exploring and learning about the tiny creatures around us.

We have also been very busy in the garden, planting lots of seeds including coriander and mint. The children were enthusiastic gardeners and are looking forward to watching them grow. Alongside this, we have been growing cress seeds, which we hope to use to make a delicious salad once they are ready.

Reception children have been working hard on their maths, focusing on counting to 20 and beyond. They have also begun instructional writing, learning how to give clear step-by-step instructions.

We have had a super week in EYFS and are so proud of all the children for their hard work and enthusiasm. Well done everyone!

Year 1:

Year 1 have had a fantastic first week back! The children returned to school well-rested and were very happy to be back with their friends, settling quickly into routines.

In Maths, we completed our learning on addition and subtraction within 10, enjoying lots of fun games and activities focused on doubling and halving. In Writing, we began our new text, *The Secret of Black Rock*, a mysterious story that has had the children completely engaged and on the edge of their seats!

Music was full of energy, as the children explored pitch by becoming superheroes and practising singing high and low notes. In Humanities, we learned about Florence Nightingale and why she was known as “The Lady of the Lamp” — the children were amazed to discover there was once a time without electric lights! While in Science, we went on a plant hunt around the school grounds and created some beautiful drawings inspired by what we found.

One of the highlights of the week was our Maths workshop, where it was wonderful to see the children enjoying learning alongside their parents. We look forward to welcoming even more parents to support their children’s learning in future sessions. It has been a wonderful start to the term, well done year 1! 😊👏

Year 2:

Wow! We are in Summer term already! It has been lovely to be back together ready for our final term of Year 2! We have hit the ground running by thinking of reasons why the dark is a good thing - inspired by our new story *The king who banned the dark*. We have been looking at art, listening to sounds and using objects to think about how the dark and the light make us feel. We also started looking at the topic of money, looking at different ways to combine coins to make amounts and give

Year 3 have had a fantastic first week back! We kicked off the term by exploring the book *Egyptology*, which inspired us to write a detailed setting description paragraph.

To further our understanding of our book, in humanities we have been focusing on Ancient Egypt, specifically when it existed and where it was located.

<p>Year 5 Faith: Year 5 have been working extremely hard this week, they have had a great week back! In maths we started our new unit and began to explore what volume is and how volume is measured, using practical activities. During writing lessons this week, we started our new text “The Lost book of adventures” . They truly immersed themselves into the book, using clues to make predictions about the text! Within reading this week, year 5 used their comprehension skills to answer questions about the book Holes which we are continuing from last term. In RSHE, they learnt about what a healthy and unhealthy relationship looks like, looking at what green and red flags are. In RE this term we are learning about Sikhism and our first lesson looked at their prior knowledge about Guru Nanak and how he became the first Guru. I am very proud of year 5 this week, they have shown amazing behaviour for learning!</p>	<p>Year 5 Hope A fantastic start for Class Hope this week, with some highly focused work and brilliant participation. We had some explorative immerse lessons at the start of the week to introduce our new Vehicle Text in writing; The Book of Lost Adventures. The children made predictions and wrote poems based on the various landscapes and adventures from the text. We had practical lessons using playdough and shape building to introduce our new maths topic: factors, multiples and prime numbers. We have started learning about Sikhism in RE. This week we learned about how Nanak became the first Guru. We were fortunate to have an RSHE workshop on Thursday and Friday, where the children learned about healthy and unhealthy friendships and relationships.</p>	<p>Year 6 Year 6 have worked incredibly hard this week as they completed their Mock SATs. Throughout the week, the children demonstrated excellent resilience, approaching each test with determination and a positive mindset. It has been wonderful to see the progress they have made, and their mature attitudes show just how prepared they are becoming for the real SATs in May. Their focus, perseverance and readiness to learn have been particularly impressive.</p> <p>In PE, pupils have been practising athletics skills in preparation for Sports Day.
